



## Town Call

At the Aberdeen Hospital, our family physicians share on-call responsibility, providing after-hours access to a family physician.

### Responsibilities can include:

- OR assists for emergency cases;
- Availability to answer questions or assess inpatients who are admitted family physician patients;
- Availability to answer questions or assess patients for community nursing homes;
- Back-up coverage to the emergency department when an ER physician requests due to long waiting room times.

Physicians receive a call stipend, plus can bill for extra services (i.e. assessing a patient, OR assisting)



# **In-patient Rounds**

The Aberdeen Hospital is a GP-run acute care hospital. Here, family physicians are responsible for their own patients when they are admitted to hospital. Some physicians choose to work collaboratively to provide inpatient coverage for their patients in a group rotation throughout the week and/or on weekends

### **How it works**

Patients are usually admitted by the emergency room physician who writes admission orders, and then transfers care to the most responsible physician, or to the town call physician if after hours. The most responsible physician would be expected to see any admitted patients, and complete history and physical by the next day at noon.

If a patient is admitted to ICU, which is a closed unit, or to a specialist, it is not your responsibility to round on them, however you can choose to do a supportive care visit if desired.

Common admission diagnoses are for COPD exacerbation's, complicated UTI's, pneumonia, and new newborn care.
